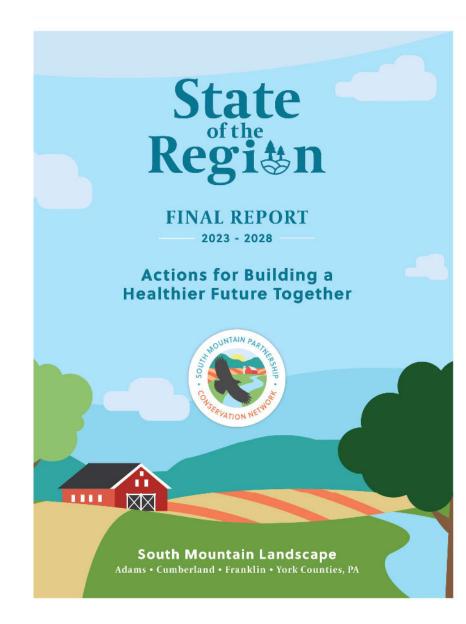
Interactive Maps

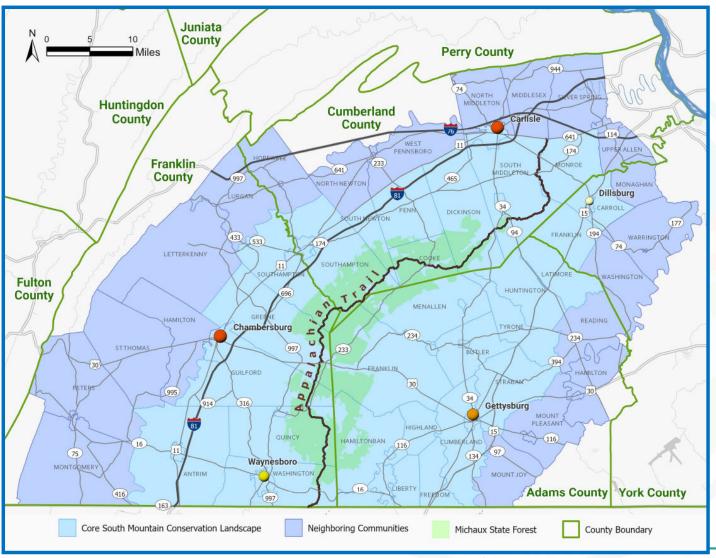
