


Tuckahoe Tract Michaux State Forest

The Tuckahoe Tract will be acquired by the DCNR Bureau of Forestry and will be open for recreation.



Location and Size

The 909-acre Tuckahoe Tract is located near Dillsburg, PA, on Tuckahoe Road. See reverse for map.

Access

Access is currently very limited to one area that includes space for a few vehicles. The bureau is working to expand access. Please note, the parking area at the Camp Tuckahoe scout area is private and not open to the public.

Recreation

The area will be open to the public for hiking, biking, and hunting. Trails are unmarked. Camping and campfires are not permitted in this tract.

History

Most of the land of the Tuckahoe Tract was formerly held by the Boy Scouts of America. The land is close to the Appalachian Trail, as well as state game lands. The scout camp is still operational today.

Plans

The bureau intends to solicit input from the public to gauge recreation priorities of prospective users. This process will guide recreational development plans. In the meantime, initial steps will include boundary marking and natural inventories. For more information, please see the <u>FAQ document</u>.
