


Carlisle Case Study: The Urban Greenway Plan

- Inform stakeholders and the public about the Trail/Urban Greenway plan


Project History

- LeTort Regional Authority (LRA) identified an expanded trail project in its 2005 Strategic Plan www.letort.org
- Countywide Greenway and Trail System Identified in the Cumberland County Open Space Preservation Plan – April 2006
- LRA received funding from the Cumberland County Land Partnerships Grant Program for Feasibility Study
- LRA issued Request for Proposals December 2006.
- BL Companies selected as consultant in March 2007

Study Area in Cumberland County
















SECTION ELEVATION- TYPICAL 36' STREET CARTWAY WITH 4' BICYCLE LANES

SECTION ELEVATION- TYPICAL RAILBED RIGHT-OF-WAY








SECTION ELEVATION- TYPICAL STREAM CORRIDOR

Source/Agency	Program	Description of Program
Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR)	Community Conservation Partnership Program (C2P2)	Grant monies are available to municipal governments and well-established non-profit land trusts to support greenway and park planning, design and development. A 50% match is required from the local project sponsor. This program includes the following specified grants: 1) Planning Grant Projects • Greenways and trails Plans; Rivers Conservation Plans 2) Acquisition Grant Projects • Park and Recreation Areas; Rails-to-Trails; Rivers Conservation 3) Development Grant Projects • Park Rehab. and Development; Greenways and Trails • Rails-to-Trails; Rivers Conservation
DCNR	PA Recreational Trails Program	Grants range from \$2,500 to \$100,000. Provides funds to develop and maintain recreation trails for motorized and non-motorized recreation trail use. The program requires a 20% match from the local sponsor. Acquisition projects require a 50% match.
Department of Environmental Protection (DEP)	Growing Greener Program	These funds can be used for farmland-preservation projects; preserving open space; cleanup of abandoned mines, watershed planning; recreational trails and parks and other land use projects. Eligible applicants include non-profit groups, counties, and municipalities. A local match is encouraged, but not required.
Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT)	Transportation Enhancements, Home Town Streets & Safe Routes to Schools Program	This cost reimbursement program funds projects within twelve categories including pedestrian and bicycle trails and bike lanes; purchase of scenic easements or scenic sites; and preservation of abandoned railway corridors. Any federal or state agency, county or municipal government, school district or non-profit can apply.
Private Developers	"Fee in Lieu of" Incentive Program	Developers may pay the Trail organization a fee to be used for acquisition, construction, maintenance of planned trail segments. Fee is in lieu of developer providing actual construction services or material costs.
Municipalities or County	Partnership	In-kind donation of construction materials, labor or services for the construction and maintenance of planned trail segments.

Trail Management

- County Management
 - Cumberland County creates new position to manage trail system
- Trail Commission
 - •Full or Part time Executive Director
 - Representitive from each Municipality
 - Non-Profit
 - Executive Director and staff

- Plan was approved by all 4 municipalities 2008
- Funding approved for bicycle lanes in the Borough of Carlisle and connector to the LeTort Nature Trail - 2009
 - Borough of Carlisle PennDOT Smart Transportation funded project
- Funding approved for improvements to LeTort Nature Trail
 2010
 - LeTort Regional Authority DCNR C2P2 funded project
- Application submitted by Borough of Carlisle for PCTI PennDOT funding for build out of bicycle lanes throughout the Borough - 2010
