
Spring Partnership Meeting

Help the Natural Heritage Inventory Update



Our ask to you: tell us about locations of quality habitat and wildlife to inform what areas are surveyed. Local contacts/landowner information is very valuable, and we ask that you include this information if able.

Through coordination from the South Mountain Partnership, the counties of Adams, Cumberland, Franklin, and York are participating in an update to their Natural Heritage Inventory. Field survey is happening this summer, led by the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy. The Inventory gathers and shares information on the location and status of important ecological resources (plants, vertebrates, invertebrates, ecological communities and geologic features) and helps inform land conversion permits and land use planning decisions.


Donations to Friends of South Mountain Partnership go to your neighbors in the form of Flex Grants! These small grants strengthen local organizations in meaningful and tangible ways. One recipient, the West

Shore Wildlife Center, provided job training to college students through a Wildlife Rehabilitation Assistant position. The project provided hands-on training while helping care for injured and orphaned wildlife.

Another Flex Grant helped the Adams County Farmers Market to develop a fresh, modern brand identity through a new logo and style guide reference. The project grows the number of shoppers to the Farmers Market, increases vendor sales and success, and supports long-term sustainability for everyone who relies on and benefits from the market in Adams County. These are just two examples of the impact made possible through our Flex Grants. Other funded projects include:

- 1) Museum Accessibility Project that provides **ramp access into the museum and signage** to direct users there. (Cumberland County Historical Society)
- 2) Cumberland County Land Preservation Forum an **educational event** that presented successful models of land conservation funding programs. (Central Pennsylvania Conservancy)
- 3) **Gardening Education and Mentorship Program** that pairs experienced gardeners with young adults to build specialized expertise in gardening and site maintenance practices benefit soil health, native plants, and wildlife. (LadyBug EarthCare)
- 4) Restore the Wittlinger provided tools and supplies needed to **remediate invasive species** from the Wittlinger Nature Preserve in Boiling Springs and owned by South Middleton Township.
- 5) Community gardening and sustainability club that creates and maintains a **community garden** where people of all ages garden together and share their knowledge and energy while promoting sustainability and healthy living. (YWCA of Cumberland County)

- Chesapeake Bay Recognized as a Hope Spot for Nature, History, and Community: The
 Chesapeake Bay, the largest estuary in the United States and the third largest in the world, has
 been officially designated a Mission Blue Hope Spot. Hope Spots are areas recognized for their
 exceptional ecological, cultural, and historical value, and this new designation celebrates the
 Chesapeake Bay's biodiversity, deep Indigenous heritage, and the broad coalition of community
 efforts driving its ongoing restoration.
- Share your opinion about public electric vehicle charging stations by June 22: The York County
 Planning Commission is seeking feedback about the expansion of electric vehicle charging
 stations across York County. Whether you own an electric vehicle or not, this survey is open to all
 York County drivers.
