#### **Power of the Partnership Wrap-Up**



The South Mountain Partnership's 15th Annual *Power of the Partnership* Celebration brought together more than 95 attendees from across the region for a day of learning, networking, and inspiration at the Cameron-Masland Mansion. Special shout out to our hosts Kings Gap Environmental Education Center staff, for welcoming us so kindly into their incredible space.

Highlights included engaging community conversations on timely regional topics, the presentation of the *Spirit of South Mountain Award* to the Tuckahoe Acquisition project, and a powerful keynote panel on creating local impact through collaboration and shared values. Speakers emphasized that conservation is not just a "nice to have," but essential to our collective future—economically, environmentally, and socially.

Over \$50,000 in Mini and Flex Grants were awarded to support ongoing conservation efforts, and attendees left energized to continue strengthening the partnerships that sustain our region.

#### **Tuckahoe Project Receives "Spirit of South Mountain" Award**



South Mountain Partnership (SMP) awards the *Spirit of South Mountain* each year to an individual, project, or organization that has made exceptional efforts to promote good stewardship of the South Mountain Region. This year's awardee was the Tuckahoe Project, enacted by Central Pennsylvania Conservancy (CPC), Cumberland County, York County, and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR). The award ceremony was held at SMP's 15th annual Power of the Partnership event on Friday, September 12, 2025.

The Tuckahoe Project involved acquiring a tract of approximately 900 acres around Camp Tuckahoe, an active Boy Scouts of America (BSA) camp in Dillsburg, Pennsylvania. Located near state game land and the Appalachian Trail, the Tuckahoe Tract protects critical habitat for important plants and wildlife, safeguards the water quality of Dogwood Run, a tributary of the Yellow Breeches Creek, and provides a buffer for the Appalachian National Scenic Trail. This core conserved area of South Mountain was at risk for development and will now serve and be enjoyed by generations to come.

# **SMP Awards Over \$50,000 in Grants to Local Conservation Projects**



Through their Mini-Grant Program and Flex Grant Program, South Mountain Partnership (SMP) awarded eight organizations a total of \$51,800 for various conservation projects throughout the region. The awards ceremony was held at the 15th annual Power of the Partnership event on Friday, September 12, at the Kings Gap Environmental Education Center in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

Mini-Grant recipients include: The Conococheague Institute, The Cumberland Valley Rails to Trails Council, Gettysburg College, The Social Enterprise Institute, and South Middleton Township.

Flex Grant recipients include: Southampton Township, Southern Appalachian Woodland Network, and Perry Yingling.

The ATCCC is an open invitation to communities within or partially within the Appalachian Trail Landscape in Pennsylvania to form community teams and apply. The Collaborative will help you to build community-led conservation projects and action plans and will provide customized technical support and peer exchange, and more – see all of the benefits in the General Information for Communities & Partners.

All communities interested in joining the Appalachian Trail Community Conservation Collaborative must submit a community application by October 31, 2025. The purpose of this application is to provide an opportunity to share more about your community and your motivations to joining the Collaborative and to help us be better prepared to meet your expectations. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis and

acceptance into the Collaborative will remain open until 15 communities are committed to the project.
